

What to do if an individual becomes unwell with COVID-19 symptoms

Prevention Measure 1 - Minimise contact with individuals who are unwell. Updated – 3rd Jan 2021 using Government Guidance 30th Dec 2020 and Staffs H and S Guidance

Staff or Pupil becomes unwell at school with:

- A new and continuous/persistent cough (coughing a lot for more than an hour or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours)
- A high temperature (Hot to the touch on chest or
- Loss or change to taste or smell is noticed



Seriously ill - Call 999!

Staff member on daily cleaning rota

Clean and disinfect classroom

Everyone in that class/ bubble to wash their hands thoroughly for 20 seconds with soap and running water.

Office Manager / Headteacher

Call parent to collect child



Supervising member of staff

Disposable mask to be placed onto child.

Member of staff to put on PPE and move the child to the staffroom, open the windows and close the door placing a 'no entry' sign on it

When the child is collected by their parent.

Child to use disabled toilet bathroom if needed. No entry sign to be placed on the door.

Parent to be given a home test kit by the school or pointed to the link by which to book one.

Child should isolate for at least 10 days.

Supervising member of staff to stay in school unless COVID symptoms develop.

Staffroom and Disabled toilet to be cleaned and disinfected.

PPE used during this event to be double bagged and stored in outdoor shed for 72 hours and destroyed with a positive result
